Isn't it incredible to think how in spite of our limitations over 350 workers have now been trained and sent out into Africa, even as far afield as Pakistan and Indonesia. To God be the glory! To date we have received 10 applications for next year, so let's pray the borders will be open by then and all will be able to come and be trained.




