
My very dear friends

My hero David Livingstone, had this said of him





Here we are in our 34th year since I started this College for the sole purpose of training pastors and missionaries for Africa. With the students not paying fees, we have put all our trust on to Jehovah Jireh and miraculously every need continues to be met. At the moment we are in touch with twenty-four mission students who hope to come in for the 2nd term, so we could be bursting at the seams! What a thrill it is to look back and see our students now working across Africa; in Rwanda, Burundi, Uganda, Tanzania, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, Ethiopia, Zambia, Namibia, Madagascar, Malawi and across South Africa. Some are pastors in England, New

Zealand, Australia, Cambodia, Paraguay, Pakistan and in Indonesia. It has been wonderful; more than three hundred and fifty students are now in the service of the Lord Jesus Christ. Please pray that the Mission Candidates will be able to navigate the Covid-19 restrictions and make it in the second term.

I completed my Diploma of Theology (partial) at Trinity Academy Pietermaritzburg (TAP) on 2002. It was a life changing experience for me. The learning that I received from Bishop Warwick and the other lecturers had really shaped my life.

The expository preaching that Bishop taught me on those days has been so much rooted in me. Until now, I am teaching that expository method to my students as well. I believe that TAP (now KZN Bible College) is the right place for all who want

to have a life changing experience and studies.

Right now, *I am trusted to be the President of William Carey Mission Theological College, in Medan, Indonesia*. Our Bible College is accredited by the Indonesia National Board of Accreditation, and currently we are running three programs:

Bachelor of Theology, Bachelor of Christian Education, and Master of Theology.

It is by God's grace that we have graduated more than 300 alumni who are working as teachers, pastors, missionaries, and also government workers. We have sent 15 mission teachers right to the interior parts of Papua till now; it's all because of God's grace and your prayers.

Thanks for sowing in my life. Thanks Bishop Warwick and Mary, Mom Charmaine, Rev. Luis, and all of my lecturers. I love all of you. Many thanks to the church members of Church of England in Pietermaritzburg. The seed that you sown was not in vain. Many thanks.

WILL AND JULIE FOWLES – Missionaries with World Wide Evangelism Cambodia, they both studied at KMBC.

Their work in Cambodia was established in 2010, *Good Neighbours* is a WEC Cambodia ministry, reaching into the remote villages of South

Eastern Cambodia with the good news of Jesus Christ. Their vision is to see every village in their area reached and transformed holistically by the power of Christ, with local leaders take ownership, all for God's glory.

We are working with a church planting team, in the villages in southeast Cambodia in the Tria commune, Samrong district, Takeo Province. To get into Cambodia and to be relevant to the community we are running a preschool (a survey found that the community wanted preschools). The project in Tria is known as Good Neighbours. With the preschool a church was started. The leadership of the church consists of some of the youth and the preschool teachers, who all converted to Christ. Because the Cambodian government stopped our NGO (WEC) from running the school, the school was handed over to a Singaporean NGO called Educational Life in Cambodia (ELIC), who took over in January 2021. We were seconded to ELIC and are privileged to be part of the project. While on home leave we were caught in the Covid-19 Lockdown restrictions, and have not been able to return to Cambodia yet. So, we manage the school "long distance" using technology and a system we have put in place. In our absence the church continues on its own. When we return to Cambodia we will oversee the school and also start new churches and help with reaching the main unreached people groups in Cambodia. We would value your prayers for the work in Cambodia and that we will soon be able to return to pick up our work there.

I am so very grateful to God for each and every student that has passed through KMBC, I love each one and they will always be part of my life. It is such a joy when they come through to visit and to share in the work that the Lord Jesus is doing through them. Each of you my dear friends, are part of this great work and I am so blessed by your support.
