What incredible words for today. Now to bring you up to date ...




KWAZULU-NATAL MISSIONARY AND BIBLE COLLEGE



(KMBC class of 2012 and school chaplains until 2015) together with their children, Loveness (12), Siyabonga (12), and Tholakele (13), are serving as ACTS13 (WEC) Missions Mobilizers in **Kwekwe**, **Zimbabwe**.



Their vision is partnering with the local church-preparing the church, workers, and creative pathways for getting the gospel to Unreached People Groups in Africa and beyond.

The farm, called **Purple Horizon**, is their central hub where **Garlic** and **Goats**, among other projects, are used to inspire and educate believers on unreached people, missions and reaching out to the lost with creative, practical opportunities.

At times the work seems too much, but Jesus gives us strength and renews our vision"

Recent developments include a water reservoir for irrigation (and future fish farming), as well as preparing a campsite for retreats, missions training and leadership development.

Anyone from KMBC; past, present or future, who wants to get involved with reaching the unreached should get in touch with them.

ACTS13 exists to mobilize the African church into world missions, and we want to see more churches sending workers to the nations.
