My dear friends,



SPURGEON wrote:

<u>ALBERT SCHWEITZER</u> was an amazing man. He was a doctor of music; of theology, of philosophy and of medicine - 4 doctorates!!

But at the age of 30 he gave up everything and came to West Africa as a missionary and with his own hands built the famous Lambarene Hospital. He wrote years later that if anyone who proposes to do good, must not expect people to roll away stones out of his way, but must accept his lot calmly if they roll a few more on it."

But why in a day when so few Churches and Colleges have any interest in MISSIONS, should I plough my life into MISSIONS? Why is missions to be our top priority?

I was incredibly challenged in my reading the other day from "My Utmost for His Highest, where Oswald Chambers wrote, this - answering my question.



Please pray that my work in Africa and in the College may flow out of a life of love and devotion.




1. KWAZULU-NATAL MISSIONARY & BIBLE COLLEGE


