



✍ NEWS FROM MY DESK FOOTPRINTS & KMBC UPDATE

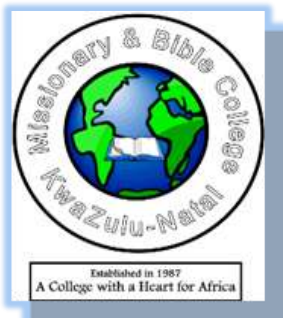

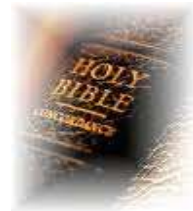
In addition, my Bible Study on a Thursday evening continues to be a time of joy and learning for us all. Next term we begin a new series on 1 Peter entitled
