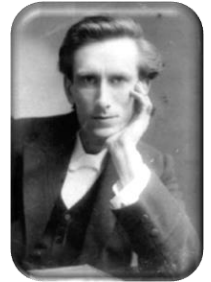

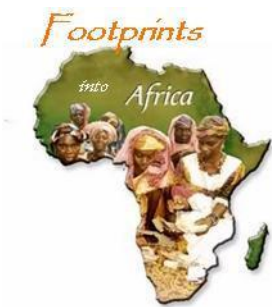
KWAZULU-NATAL MISSIONARY AND BIBLE COLLEGE

Afterward we went down to the beach to enjoy a picnic together, it was wonderful.

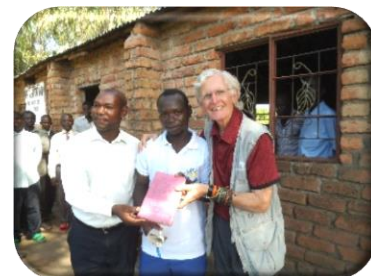
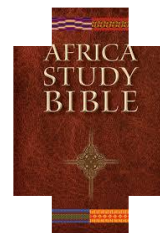


FOOTPRINTS INTO AFRICA

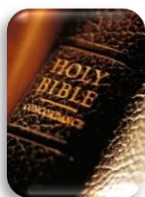
UGANDA MISSION:

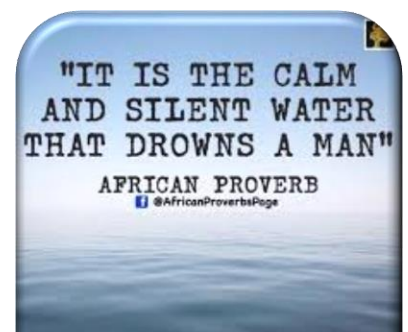
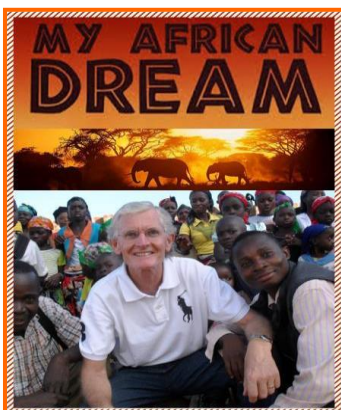
